How does Scopus compare with other databases?

- More coverage of scientific, technical, medical and social science literature (14,000 titles) than any other database
- Full text links directly from the results list
- Abstracts back to 1966, a full 10-year reference backfile beginning in 1996, and daily updates
- Innovative tools to help you refine your search to relevant results
- Alerts for you to keep abreast of your research topic

Does Scopus offer full text access?

YES! Many of the entries in Scopus link to the full text of Jefferson's electronic journal subscriptions, as well as to the full text of the patents and websites included. *Remember, if you login from off campus, you may need to visit the Cyber Café to be recognized as a valid Jefferson user by our proxy server.*

Scopus Features/Navigation Bar:

- **Search** The **Search** page allows you to search our collection for specific scientific documents.
- **Sources** The **Sources** page allows you to browse an alphabetical listing or search for available Scopus sources and titles.
- **My Alerts** The **Alerts** page allows you to view a list of previously saved search alerts or citation alerts.
- **My List** The **My List** page allows you to collect records within the session and across the session. You may select records and save them for later use within the session but you can also choose to save records in a basket permanently.
- **My Profile** The **My Profile** page allows you to view or modify your account or profile information and set up preferences for this application, such as changing your password and setting up a list of alerts or saved searches.

- Save lists to your profile
- Modify preferences
