COURSE DESCRIPTION

The Sleep Medicine Symposium is designed for primary care physicians and selected specialists, including sleep medicine, pulmonary/critical care, neurology, psychiatry, cardiology, pediatrics and dentists. The Sleep Medicine Symposium is also designed for other allied health care providers such as psychologists, physician extenders, respiratory therapists, sleep medicine technologists, and nurse specialists. This symposium will address commonly encountered sleep disorders, including insomnia, sleep apnea syndrome, restless legs syndrome, shift work disorder and parasomnias, among others. The combined format of live panel debates, morning breakout sessions and didactic presentations will allow participants to observe and question faculty practitioners as they discuss specific and challenging case scenarios, and demonstrate how to apply new information and clinical guidelines into their practices.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of this conference, participants should be able to:

- Examine basic principles based upon most recent practice parameters, and select the appropriate pharmacological agents and behavioral strategies in the management of insomnia
- Assimilate a systematic, evidence-based, approach to the evaluation of insomnia
- Assess the effects of excessive sleepiness and shift work disorder on performance
- Utilize various inventories such as the Epworth Sleepiness Scale in the identification and quantification of excessive sleepiness
- List methods of identifying patients at high risk of OSA in the perioperative and inpatient setting
- Identify the spectrum of treatment modalities for OSA and assimilate practice guidelines for the treatment of OSA in the primary care setting
- Summarize the role of emerging technologies such as home sleep testing in the diagnosis of OSA
- Analyze sleep laboratory diagnostic findings that are necessary to diagnose OSA and to establish its severity.
- Summarize the impact of effective management of sleep disorders on cardiovascular abnormalities
- Discuss and provide to patients safety measures that parasomnia patients should adhere to for their own protection and for the protection of others
- Assess their individual practice in light of the information and discussions during the course, and identify specific strategies to implement as part of a continuing improvement process for their practices.
