7. Which attendings had the greatest influence on your experience? Dr. Davis oversees the fourth year elective and is a great teacher. Dr. Noah and Dr. Esther were also interested in teaching students. Attendings overall were excited to have fourth year students and treated me as a member of the team.

8. What were your daily duties? Attend morning report every day. Round with the fellows and attendings on patients admitted to pulmonary service (was not expected to write progress notes or follow these patients). Perform consults on the general peds floors and in the NICU and PICU. Attend flexible bronchoscopies in the bronchoscopy suite as well as in the operating rooms. Occasionally, I would see patients in the outpatient subspecialty clinic and learned how to perform pulmonary function testing in this setting. Additionally, I worked to prepare a case presentation that fourth year students are required to present to pulmonary fellows and attendings as well as radiology attendings at UNC Chest Conference.

10. Any tips on how to get the most out of this rotation? During this rotation, I had very little responsibility for following patients and knowing intricate details about patients on the service or consult patients. Therefore, I had much more time and flexibility during this rotation. As a result, I got to see a vast array of pulmonary pathology and attend a lot of bronchoscopies. The goals of the rotation are very much self-directed so I just let the fellow or resident know what I was interested in doing.

12. Did you get a letter of recommendation? No – didn't ask.
13. Did this rotation help you get an interview? Yes, everyone who does the rotation is guaranteed an interview.
14. Is housing provided? If not, any recommendations on where to stay? The program coordinator was able to help students find housing with other medical students/residents.
15. Is parking provided? If not, any recommendations on where to park? Yes – parking pass is provided for 30 dollars.

I would recommend obtaining your immunization records and getting titers drawn from student health/personal doctors very early in the process.
