The program will begin at 8:30AM and will conclude at 5:00 PM.

ERCP Skills: An *In-depth Review with Live Observation* is part of an on-going series directed by the Pancreaticobiliary and Advanced Endoscopy Section of the Jefferson Division of Gastroenterology and Hepatology. The program is designed for licensed healthcare professionals that are practicing ERCP. Teams of physicians, nurses, and/or technicians are encouraged to apply to deepen team learning and communications.

This full-day "boutique" CME accredited course uniquely combines didactic material and live-case demonstrations to provide interested participants with a comprehensive small-group learning experience. Participants will have the opportunity to directly observe live cases and interact with the advanced endoscopy team performing the procedures. In this fashion, the nuances of performing ERCP, often lost in large scale live endoscopy courses, can be optimally conveyed and appreciated. The program will focus on ERCP techniques of particular relevance to the community gastroenterologist including cannulation techniques, sphincterotomy, stone extraction, lithotripsy, biliary and pancreatic stenting, ampullectomy, and cholangioscopy.

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Course Description

This course uniquely combines didactic material and live-case demonstrations to provide interested participants with a comprehensive small-group learning experience. Participants will have the opportunity to directly observe live cases and interact in-person with the advanced endoscopy team performing the procedure. In this fashion, the nuances of performing ERCP can be optimally conveyed and appreciated. The program will focus on basic and advanced ERCP techniques of particular relevance to the community gastroenterologist performing advanced procedures. Focused topics include fully covered biliary SEMS, bilateral biliary stent placement, cholangioscopy, biliary PDT, dilation-assisted stone extraction, stone fragmentation, pseudocyst drainage, and enteral stenting.

Course Objectives

- Identify appropriate situations and indications for the performance of specific techniques in advanced ERCP
- Discuss the risks and benefits of advanced ERCP techniques
- Describe technological advances in ERCP and how and when new technologies should be incorporated into practice.
- Examine how the endoscopy team and environment promotes the safe performance of advanced ERCP techniques
- Examine when and how to use a wide variety of biliary stents in both benign and malignant diseases involving the bile duct
- Review current authoritative clinical recommendations for the appropriate use of advanced ERCP techniques
- Assess individual practice in light of the information and discussions during the course, and identify specific strategies to implement as part of a continuing improvement process for their practices
